### SUPPORTING YOUNG PEOPLE TO SET THE AGENDA:

All 4 charters were launched on 4th February 2021, coinciding with Children's Mental Health Awareness Week. All of the charters had different key messages but there were **four common** themes from across the UK.

Young people want:

- Services that listen
- Reduced waiting times
- Flexible support
- An end to inequality and discrimination.

# **CO-PRODUCE SOLUTIONS:**

Every nation collaborated with young people to host online **roundtable events** and in England, young people led an inperson **'deep-dive'**. These events brought young people together with practitioners, professionals and key national and local decisionmakers in order to co-produce solutions for systems change. Almost **100 young people** co-produced events which saw **130 stakeholders** attend

# SUPPORTING YOUNG PEOPLE TO SET THE AGENDA:

Partners from across the UK supported young people to think about what a **young person-centred mental health system** would need to look like to ensure it was holistic, rights-based and accessible to them.

Each nation created their own version of a charter that was specific to the needs of young people in each country.



# EMPOWER YOUNG PEOPLE TO LEAD CHANGE:

Following the charter launch, young people across the UK were supported to undertake **youth social action** to promote their key messages.

This included:

- Sharing their stories and journeys through <u>blogs</u>, podcasts & interviews
- Social media takeovers
- Meeting with key decisionmakers
- Hosting briefing sessions and workshops for practitioners
- Themed skills development and training sessions
- Feeding into the <u>#FundtheHubs</u> <u>campaign</u> (England)
