Our community

Our members shape everything we do, meaning our membership is designed specifically for the youth advice and counselling community.

Members consistently tell us they value spaces to connect with other members so we set up a series of networks. Together the community enjoys an Advice Network, Counselling Network and CEO Network. These spaces allow attendees to meet informally and shape discussions with staff in similar roles across the UK.

The community also shapes our event offering. Alongside experts and guest speakers, some of our recent online events explored the Cost of Living Crisis, Strategic Influencing and Using Data Effectively. Meanwhile, our Member Meet event provides the community with a much-needed space to connect in person.

We share a catalogue of resources for the community online. Our Members Area offers toolkits, training videos, a forum and guides, and we're always adding more resources to help our members continue providing young people with the highest-quality support. Drive equity

Youth Information, Advice and Counselling Services engage with and support more young people from worst-served groups.

Improve experience

Youth Information, Advice and Counselling Services are designed and run effectively according to evidence, good practice and young people's voice



Why young people (oveYIACS

Our members come in all shapes and sizes as they grow in response to the needs of their community. This is one of many reasons young people love Youth Information, Advice and Counselling Services (YIACS).

Open access

Early intervention is the most effective form of support. That's why a YIACS will never turn a young person away because they are "not sick enough".

Effective

YIACS have comparable clinical outcomes to CAMHS and schoolbased counselling.

Wider reach

YIACS have better reach to young people from worst-served backgrounds who may otherwise slip through the cracks of statutory services and school settings.

Bridging the gap

YIACS support young people up to age 25, bridging the gap between child and adult care and, crucially, supporting young people on their journey into adulthood.

What young people want

Young people have complex and intersecting needs. The whole-life support they receive from our members is not only vital but what young people tell us they want.

We work with our members to help them offer the full YIACS model and campaign and build the evidence base so that young people from all local authority areas can access YIACS with sufficient capacity.



Why members we Youth Access

The Young Person's Advisory Service (YPAS) in Liverpool has been a dedicated member of Youth Access for over a decade, contributing to the national recognition of the YIACS model. Their CEO, Monique Collier, shares why they love being a Youth Access member.

Youth Access passionately advocates for multi-disciplined early intervention and prevention services, as evidenced by their extensive research, publications, and policy development efforts.

Youth Access stands as a driving force on a national scale for early support hubs, one-stop-shops, accessible provision and seamless pathways whilst championing the voices of community hubs, championing for the voices of young people. Their invaluable support has bolstered the confidence of voluntary sector services, fostering closer collaboration with the statutory sector.

As a proactive member of Youth Access, YPAS ensures ongoing active involvement and we recognise that while Youth Access can't singlehandedly steer the course, they play a crucial role in guiding the way and reshaping the narrative and painting a different picture beyond government recognition. A picture painted with crossroads, opened doors, multiple routes, and vibrant colours, symbolising the YIACS model with a range of services across multiple venues and seamless connection points led by a team of multi-disciplined practitioners. YPAS's influence extends locally, which for many years now has benefited from increased investment from both NHS (ICB) and Local Authority. With newfound attention from the government via the DHSC pilot, there's confidence that the collective national membership will demonstrate the value of the YIACS model. This, in turn, will influence the national spending review concerning children and young people's mental health.



For providers contemplating joining this national collective of YIAC services, the benefits are substantial; organisational kudos, elevated organisational visibility, access to a national collective of YIACS for shared learning, regular strategy and policy updates, access to essential publications and opportunities for involvement and engagement in current campaigns and consultations.
